Service Offerings

WELCOME HOME

In August of 2021 we launched our Welcome Home Initiative which is Ta'leef's commitment to serving the community through providing the space, content and companionship that allows the hearts and minds of our community to feel at home to open the doors towards personal growth, worship, and continued learning. This first phase focused on the door into the community. We launched many programs and services this year that assist in keeping that door to fellowship and faith open to those interested in Islam, those new to it, and those renewing their faith. We are now entering the second phase after the open door comes to the community's living room. In this phase, we are focusing on community building, education, and character-building which will be reflected in our media and programs. We have for years described Ta'leef as the Living Room of the community and are placing our resources and energy into building on that.

Media Offerings

- Ta'leef launched the Welcome Home Blog with Dr. Will Caldwell, a resource for seekers
 and new Muslims that provides reflections and advice on learning and living Islam. New
 articles are posted every month. Total Articles- 30 Articles.
- Ta'leef's very own "Welcome Home" Podcast was made available to the community.
 Which gave beneficiaries full access to our weekly programming and events. Total Completed Sets: 10 Series Sets.



NEWCOMERS

Each year, Ta'leef looks forward to hosting a range of retreats for the community. One of them is the Newcomers Retreat. The Newcomers Retreat is extremely powerful because it brings those who have embraced Islam together, both the fresh & well-seasoned, giving them a grounding and empowering experience. Isolation and confusion are common experiences that newcomers to Islam face. This retreat is designed to help newcomers connect with community, recenter God in their lives, and reinforce their knowledge through engaging workshops and fun activities. This year, we held our retreat in the Nations Capital, Washington DC, at the Divanet Center with 35 attendees joining us from all around the US. The retreat itself was a five day intensive, where we covered essential topics that would provide a newcomer to Islam with a grounding in the religion that leads to empowerment. These include applied theology, practical jurisprudence, prophetic biography, spirituality, and mentorship sessions that address critical questions and inquiries. Attendees bonded through daily tahajjud prayer, martial arts sessions, as well as evening workshops. This practical and uplifting approach created not only a strong bond with the Divine, but also a strong and lasting relationship between attendees, teachers, and volunteers! Due to the generosity of donors in the community we were able to provide full tuition scholarships to all who were in need.



Here is one story that is close to our hearts. Read about Carmen's story!



Carmen first began looking into Islam because she needed a spiritual efuge. "I just started reading. I admired the faith and orientation of my Muslim friends. The very first thing I started doing was praying salah regularly before even taking shahada. I didn't overwhelm myself and I vasn't sure that I would want to commit to Islam but found refuge and meaning in prayer." However, this was a lonely journey that she took for a couple of years before finding a community. She prayed and fasted Ramadan on her own. "I got to this crossroad where I love all these devotional practices I'm engaging in. It all makes sense to me but I didn't know if I could keep doing it by myself or if I need a community. Once I got a taste of community I quickly decided that this is what I wanted."

MCC East Bay became her first spiritual home and she finally found Taleef through our organization's partnership with the convert care program there. She reached out to Mike Swies, our Outreach Director, for a one-to-one meeting, and eventually said her shahadah at Taleef Fremont. "One of the most beautiful things to me was that my brother came to my shahada and he was made to feel welcome. Mahdy had him come up, sit with me and hold my hand. Mahdy really honored my brother at the moment that I embraced Islam.... Afterward my brother said it was an amazing experience and he might want to go back sometime and that is a testament to how welcome he felt and how he felt how was there."

Carmen honored us by attending our annual Newcomers Retreat in November, where she had to opportunity to take a deep dive into the fundamentals of Islam and build bonds with her brothers and sisters on the path. "I realized I was in a group of people who really understood this spiritual journey and were on the same spiritual journey that I had never experienced before. The newcomers' retreat really nourished me and aided me on many levels spiritually, emotionally and socially."
